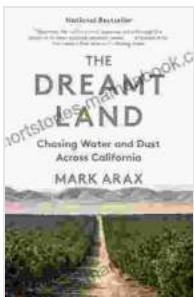


Chasing Water and Dust Across California: A Photographic Journey

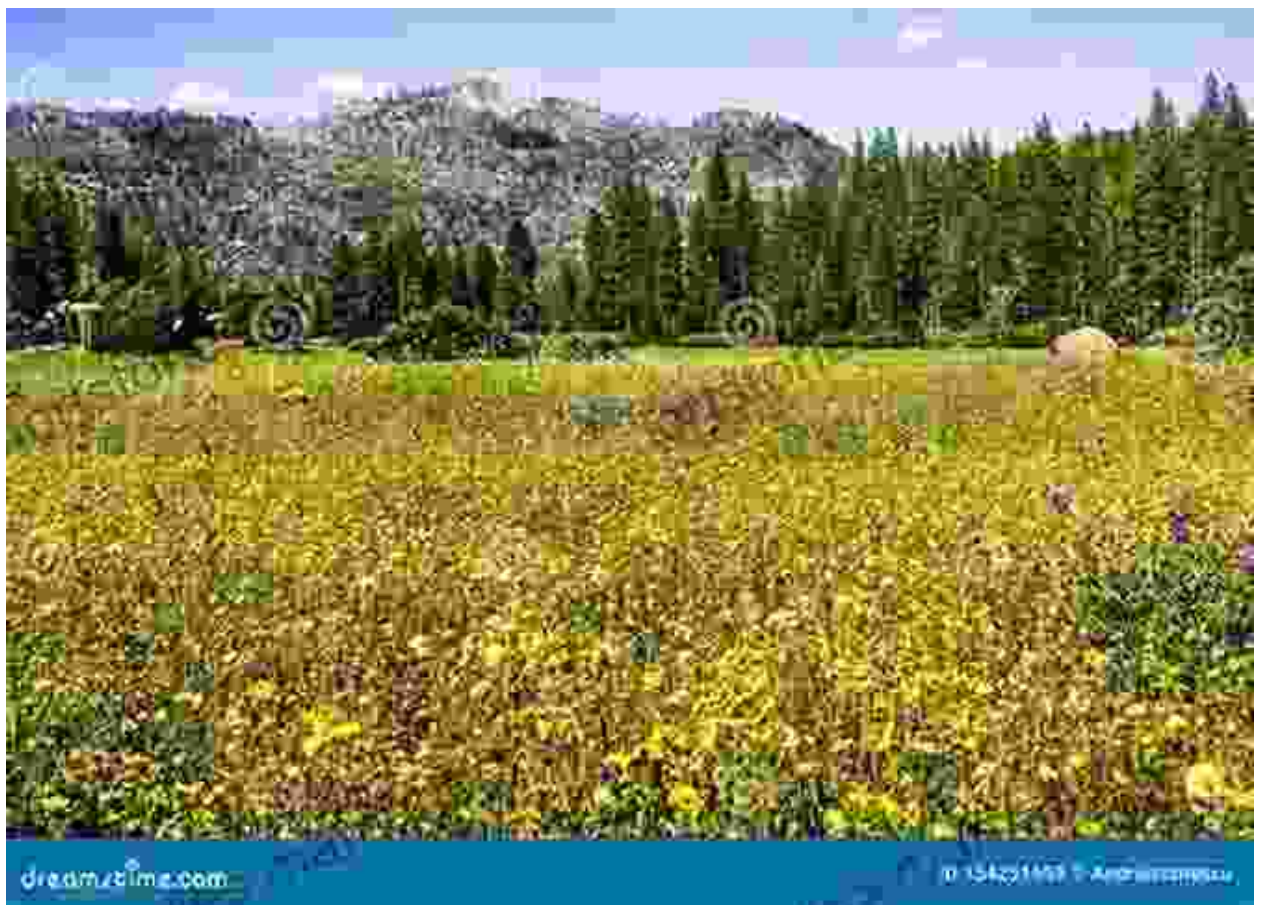

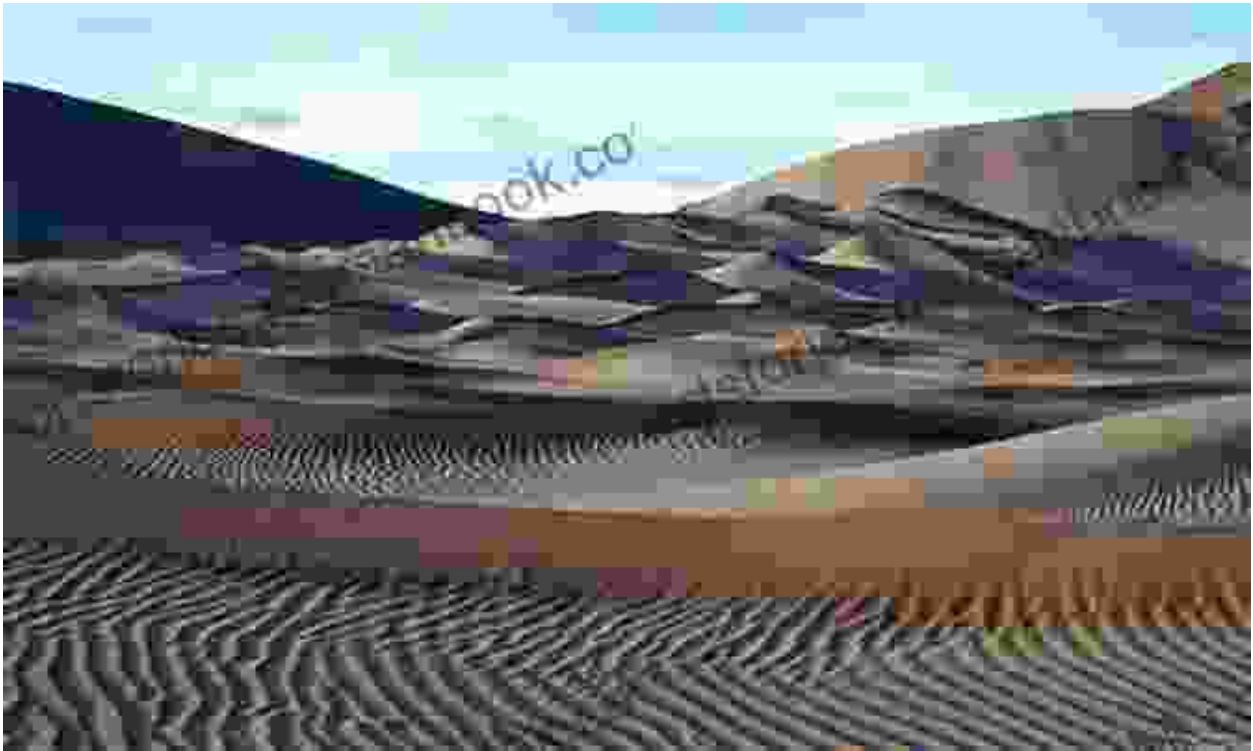






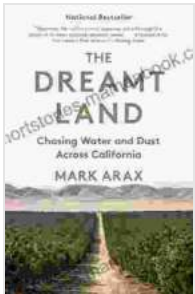
